While the state legislature has not yet completed its first full month of work, significant progress has been made on issues important to our Association.

Last week (1-20-16) the Senate Transportation Committee voted to advance a bill that would raise fuel taxes beginning on October 1, 2016. SB623 would raise the gas tax 1 and 1/2 cents a gallon and the diesel tax by 3 and 1/2 cents. Sen. Doug Libla is sponsoring the fuel tax bill which could see senate floor debate before too long.

In his annual state message, Gov. Nixon announced that state workers should get a 2% pay raise. Legislative leaders have also indicated a pay raise is in order however a projected amount has not been specified.

In other matters of interest; HB2228 by Rep. Jay Barnes of Jefferson City, specifies that state employees shall receive 10 consecutive days of paid leave upon the birth or adoption of a child. It was heard Monday (1-20-16) in the House Government Oversight Committee.

HB1422, by Rep. Nate Walker of Kirksville, says that a state worker who works 10-hour days and 40 hours a week cannot be required to take two hours of vacation leave for paid holidays. The bill was scheduled for hearing this week but was postponed pending a language revision.
